





BACKGROUND



The Memorial Union opened in 1927



No elevators or ramps were constructed into the building



In 1959, elevators and exterior ramps were added to the east and west entries



In 1973, interior ramps were added to the Rotunda



Today, the Memorial Union is still striving to achieve a shared vision of universal accessibility



Access Survey Completed in 2011


In 2011 SZS Consulting (Palo Alto, CA) completed a full building review of access barriers in the Memorial Union. They identified over **652 barriers** that included pathways, restrooms, door handles, signage, and way finding



Our Commitment to Accessibility


Within 5 years of the report, the Memorial Union plans to have addressed all these barriers **except the Rotunda**, due to funding.

Why is access so important to the Memorial Union?




Major Campus Foot Traffic to the Memorial Union

In 2006, a survey showed that **approximately half** of the campus student body uses the Memorial Union. The only east/west pathway through the building is across the Rotunda.

ROTUNDA PROJECT OVERVIEW



Rotunda Access Improvement Study Completed in 2013

In 2013, FFA Architecture, a firm that specializes in solving access problems in historic buildings created a feasibility study to correct the Rotunda's accessibility problems. They identified **3 major barrier** groups.




Barrier Group #1 Memorial Union Main Entry


Raise the elevation of the exterior landing to eliminate the 6" step at the exterior door threshold




Barrier Group #2 Interior Ramps Interior ramps, handrails, and 3-riser stairs are removed



Barrier Group #3 Lobby Lobby floor is modified to match entry level elevation




Rotunda Access Cost Study Completed 2013




